This year, we proudly celebrated the office's 35th year, and we are excited to provide you with a snapshot of one of the most eventful years in the history of Campus Engagement and Leadership (CEL). Since 1984, CEL has had 7 directors, 4 name changes, and experienced a University name change.

No year was more rewarding or more of a challenge than this one, and here are just a few highlights:

- The year began with the largest BraveNation Bash yet, boasting almost 1,000 students in attendance.
- Actor Diane Guerrero was the most-attended Distinguished Speaker since 2012 and drew over 800 people.
- CEL collaborated with PAC, SGA, and GPAC to produce the Homecoming Comedy Show featuring Desi Banks and Ryan Davis-- the first sold out event for the office since 2007.
- The 27th Annual CEL Talent Show went virtual and was the most viewed EVER!
- · Fraternity and Sorority Life membership grew 26 percent.
- Over 250 campus events were sponsored by UNC Pembroke clubs and organizations.

Of course, COVID-19 changed the narrative for the office during the Spring 2020 Semester. Many programs were adjusted, and CEL staff adapted masterfully to the changes with continued productivity. The office amassed record social media contact and set records for attendance at some events, though everything was presented virtually after Spring Break.

We hope you enjoy this annual report. It summarizes some of the work of my talented staff and our amazing students. We seek to provide each student at UNC Pembroke with at least one lifelong positive memory before they graduate. It's safe to say that there were many positive memories created this year for students. We are looking forward to year 36 and many more fantastic accomplishments!






FICOVID-19
