**Composition/Rhetoric.** UNC Pembroke seeks to fill multiple tenure-track positions in Composition/Rhetoric. Ph.D.s in Composition/Rhetoric required, ABDs considered. Specialization is open, but we are particularly interested in candidates working in such fields as professional writing, computers and composition, digital rhetorics, critical race theory, working class rhetorics, the pedagogy of composition, and basic writing. We seek candidates who can contribute to a growing Composition/Rhetoric curriculum at the undergraduate and M.A. levels as well as to UNCP's general education composition sequence. Additionally, there is expectation of service/scholarly activity. UNC Pembroke, founded in 1887 as the nation's first Native American normal school, is today one of the most culturally diverse rural universities in the nation. A growth enrollment institution whose student population has grown 65% in 5 years, UNCP values its faculty of teacher-scholars, and the successful candidate will join a dynamic department whose faculty are active in the American Indian Studies major, the Gender Studies minor, the Writing minor, the University Honors College, a writing-across-the-curriculum program, the University Writing Center, and more.
