



Assistant or Associate Professor in Printmaking

The University of North Carolina, Pembroke seeks an Assistant or Associate Professor with ability to teach multiple courses in printmaking and supervise and maintain a traditional print studio.

Qualifications: MFA in Printmaking, an exhibition record and teaching experience in Printmaking beyond graduate school level. Demonstrated ability to teach traditional printmaking processes including stone and aluminum plate lithography, intaglio, relief printmaking, and silkscreen. An understanding of digital and toner experimental printmaking processes is desirable.

Responsibilities: Teach four courses each semester. Participation in committee work, departmental and university activities, and advising. Professional activities and community activities are encouraged and will be required for positive performance evaluations. The candidate will help with curriculum development, assessment, and long range planning. Teach courses other than printmaking in secondary art discipline. Maintain a safe, well equipped print studio with green practices when possible.

The print studio is equipped with:

Takach floor model lithography press with a 59" x 33 1/2" press bed
American French Tool floor model etching press with a 29" x 48" steel press bed
Dickerson table model combination press with a 46" x 46" bed
