Using *CINAHL Plus with Full Text*

Access: Go to the Library's homepage at www.uncp.edu/library/. Click **Electronic Resources**. Under **Databases by Title**, click the letter **C** and you will see a list of databases. Click **CINAHL Plus with Full Text**.

Advanced Search: The advanced search also allows you to combine and experiment with various sets of keywords (see image below). You can interchange different words with similar meaning using **or** (e.g. **treatment or care**). You can also truncate words with an asterisk (e.g. **treat*** = **treated**, **treating**, **treatment**, and **treats**).

Advanced Search Limits: The advanced search also allows you to limit your searches in various ways (see image below). The most popular limits are **Peer Reviewed** (which will bring up only the most scholarly materials), **Date Published from** (which allows you to search a specific date range), and also **Full Text** (which only pulls up complete articles); however, for a greater selection of articles, do not limit to full text but instead use the *Journal Finder* link to search for full-text articles.

The Results List: Articles in the results list are arranged by date published with the most recent articles listed first (see image below). The results list shows 10 items at a time. To see the next 10 items, click the page numbers or **Next** link. Full-text articles are listed as **PDF Full Text**, **HTML Full Text**, or **Linked Full Text** and article citations will have the **Check Journal Finder for full text availability** link. Students can request items via **Document Delivery** using the **Request Item** link.



You can print or email or save the full-text articles or article citations. Use the linked subject headings (e.g., **Diabetes Mellitus, Insulin...**) on the left to narrow the results.

Article Citations: Citations to articles contain important identifying information, such as the author, title, and publication information, but not the full text of the article (see image below). Article citations usually provide descriptors (subjects) and abstracts (summaries) to help you evaluate articles for relevancy to your topic. Click the **Check Journal Finder for full text availability** link to see if the full-text article is available in another database or in the Library. If not, you can click the **Request Item** link to request the full text. Click the **Result List** link to return to the results list.
