Using WorldCat


WorldCat is a worldwide catalog. It can be used to locate books in the Livermore library and books in other libraries. To access *WorldCat*, click **Electronic Resources**. Click **W** under Databases by Title. Click **WorldCat**. If you are off campus, a log-in screen will appear asking for your first or last name, Banner ID number, and library PIN. (Contact the Reference Desk if you need assistance.) *WorldCat* should then open. If *WorldCat* does not open in the the Advanced Search (see image below), click **Advanced Search**.

Type **how or why** in the first search box. (see image below).

Type **folklore** in the second box.

Click **Books** in the **Limit type** to section (see image below).

Select **Juvenile** and **Fiction** from the Subtype menus (see image below).

Novelist Plus

Novelist Plus is a combination of *Novelist* and *Novelist K-8*. Books are searchable by author, title, series name, Lexile level (reading level), and plot (including character, topic, time period, and setting) to retrieve descriptions, reviews, discussion guides, and feature articles related to books of interest. Readers may select from information provided to find similar books that appeal to them. Updated and expanded monthly, the service also includes lists of award-winning fiction, book lists arranged by genre and subgenre, feature articles, thematic units and more.
