### Electronic Databases:

#### *Academic Search Premier*

A multi-disciplinary database for over 8,000 publications, with full text for nearly 4,500 of those titles. PDF backfiles to 1975 or further are available for well over one hundred journals, and searchable cited references are provided for more than 1,000 titles.

#### *Access NewspaperARCHIVE*

*NewspaperARCHIVE* contains tens of millions of newspaper pages from 1759 to present, and each newspaper located in the database can be searched by keyword or specific date.

#### *America: History and Life*

This database indexes articles, reviews, and dissertations for significant events in both U.S. and Canadian history. It is important to keep in mind that this database does not have any full-text articles, but it does lead users to other resources such as *JournalFinder* which would provide full-text information.

### *LexisNexis Academic Universe*

The LexisNexis Academic Universe database provides users with access to a wide range of news, business, legal and reference information in full-text format.

### *OmniFile Full-Text, Mega Edition*

*OmniFile* is a good multi-disciplinary database providing the complete content - indexing, abstracts, and full text - from six of Wilson's full-text databases. Users should check their citations in *JournalFinder* to determine if the specific articles are available in print or electronic format.
