## Using *PsycARTICLES*

**Access:** Go to the Library's homepage at [www.uncp.edu/library/](http://www.uncp.edu/library/). Click **Electronic Resources**. Click **Database Title**. Click the letter **P** and you will see a list of databases. Click **PsycARTICLES**.

**Basic Search:** The basic search screen comes up automatically when you open the database. Enter your keywords in the **Find** box and click the **Search** button (see image below). You can combine keywords by using **and** (e.g. **autism and treatment**). You can interchange different words with similar meaning (such as 'teen' and 'adolescent') using **or** (e.g. **teen or adolescent**). You can also truncate words with an asterisk (e.g. **treat\*** = **treats, treated, treating, and treatment**).

**The Results List:** Articles in the results list are arranged by date published with the most recent articles listed first. All articles are listed as having **PDF Full Text** or **HTML Full Text**. Articles can be printed, emailed, or saved to a disk by clicking the **Print**, **E-mail**, or **Save** links. If you are unsure of whether or not you would like to use an article, you may place it in a temporary folder by clicking **Add**.

**Article Citations:** Citations to articles contain important identifying information, such as the author, title, and publication information. Article citations usually provide abstracts (summaries) to help you evaluate articles for relevancy to your topic (see image below). Click the **Result List** link in order to return to the results list.

<b>Abstract:</b>	A clinical memory test was administered to 38 high-functioning children with <i>autism</i> and 38 individually matched normal controls, 8–16 years of age. The resulting profile of memory abilities in the children with <i>autism</i> was characterized by relatively poor memory for complex visual and verbal information and spatial working memory with relatively intact associative learning ability, verbal working memory, and recognition memory. A stepwise discriminant function analysis of the subtests found that the Finger Windows subtest, a measure of spatial working memory, discriminated most accurately between the <i>autism</i> and normal control groups. A principal components analysis indicated that the factor structure of the subtests differed substantially between the children with <i>autism</i> and controls, suggesting differing organizations of memory ability.

**Advanced Search:** Click the **Advanced Search** tab at the top of the screen in order to combine and experiment with various sets of keywords. For example, if you were researching ‘how does work-related stress impact mental health of employees?’, then you would use the first two **Find** boxes to enter the main keywords (**health or well-being** and **stress**) and the third **Find** box to experiment with different concepts for the work environment, such as **employ\* or workplace or occupation\*** (see image below).
