James B. Chavis

Recognizes an employee who exemplifies character, professionalism and commitment to the mission of Student Affairs at UNCP.

Program of the Year

Recognizes programs by an individual or team that have a positive impact on the campus community. The program must have: originated from at least one department within Student Affairs, addressed a specific problem or issue and made a positive impact on the campus community.

Energizer

Recognizes employees who have helped energize and enhance staff spirit and morale. Must demonstrate support for other staff, bring positive energy for self and others at work, and promote the involvement and engagement of others in their work.

New Employee

Recognizes a permanent employee of Student Affairs (2 years or less) within the Administrative Support Staff, Environmental Services Staff and Professional Staff categories. Must demonstrate excellence in serving students, sustained superior work performance and a positive attitude, initiative, and cooperative spirit while working with others.

UNCP Ambassador

Recognizes an employee or group of employees who have brought recognition to UNCP outside of the campus community while performing professional duties.



Star

Recognizes employees within the Administrative Support Staff, Environmental Services Staff and Professional Staff who have demonstrated consistent, exceptional service to Student Affairs. Must have been a permanent employee of Student Affairs for over 2 years, demonstrated consistent, exceptional service, and a positive attitude toward students, staff and their work. Demonstrated a willingness to go beyond the expectations of the job.

Community

Recognizes employees within the Administrative Support Staff, Environmental Services Staff and Professional Staff categories who have served the off campus community in a significant manner in a volunteer effort during the past year of the nomination or is recognized for long-term service to Robeson County community as an individual or member of community service organization.

Research/ Publications / Grants

Recognizes individuals (or teams) in Student Affairs who have conducted research, published articles, presented programs or were awarded grants which have increased knowledge about student life of student affairs.

Bright Idea

Recognizes an employee within the Administrative Support Staff, Environmental Services Staff and Professional Staff who has suggested an idea or procedure that, when implemented, resulted in improved operations in a department of Student Affairs. Employee must have: submitted an idea that improved operations, and/or submitted an idea that improved cost-effectiveness, and/or submitted an idea that improved a procedure that enhanced safety or convenience, and/or submitted an idea that brought about a solution to a problem.
