  - 1.1 **Create a new 3 credit-hour elective course, SWK 389 Sexual Minorities.**  
Prerequisites—None.
  - 1.2 **Create a new 3 credit-hour elective course, SWK 370 Practice with Children and Adolescents.** Prerequisites—Recommend SWK 200.
  - 1.3 **Create a new 3 credit-hour required course, SWK 371 Writing for the Social Sciences.**  
Pre or Corequisite—SWK 200.
  - 1.4 **Modify the Social Work Program (BSW) by adding a required 3 hour course SWK 371 Writing for the Social Sciences and reducing the number of university-wide electives hours from 24 to 21. Total Number of hours remains unchanged.**
2. **Proposals from Department of Chemistry and Physics:**
  - 2.1 **Delete the Medical Technology track in the BS in Chemistry degree program.**
