STEM PROGRAM






OPEN HOUSE at NC STATE UNIVERSITY

National Chemistry Week Event, Laurinburg, NC, October 21, 2017

The North Carolina Local Section of the ACS is teaming with the University of North Carolina at Pembroke in celebration of National Chemistry Week 2017. The theme for the event was "Chemistry Rocks" which kicked off National Chemistry Week. The event was held at the Scotland County Memorial Library on Saturday, October 21 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Volunteers were from UNCP Chemistry and Physics, the Gamma Sigma Sigma Epsilon Chemistry Honor Society, UNCP Nursing, UNCP Biology, AISES, UNCP Geology and Geography, Black and Veatch, St. Andrews Chemistry, Steven Roberts Bakery, 4-H, and Novo Nordisk.

The activities included the following: making slime, testing the pH of various household chemicals, Gaviscon heartburn medicine demo, a geochemistry lesson about rocks, STEM challenges, chemistry of food science (baking bread), proper hand washing techniques, bees and the production of honey, making borax/sugar crystals, dissolving M&M candies, measuring the mass of pennies from different time periods, and coloring aprons with the digestive system. We even had science photo props for super fun pictures.

With over 250 people visiting the library for the event, the tables received a steady flow of traffic. Each child received a certificate of appreciation for attending and freebies such as moles, stickers, pencils, and tattoos. A copy of "Celebrating Chemistry" was provided to each child. 





AMERICAN SOCIETY MICROBIOLOGISTS CONFERENCE




















UNCP HOMECOMING PARADE
