Lecturer in Criminal Justice

The Department of Sociology and Criminal Justice invites applications for one Lecturer of Criminal Justice position. The ideal candidate will begin duties January, 2020. Candidates who can begin in August, 2020 will be considered.

In addition to a full range of criminal justice major teaching responsibilities, the successful candidate will be required to serve as a student advisor, teach writing enriched courses, and perform additional duties as directed by the department chair.

Teach introductory level, intermediate, and advanced courses in criminology, and criminal justice, specifically classes in the Terrorism Studies Minor. Opportunities may be available to teach graduate courses in criminal justice. This position may require teaching and advising assignments at off-campus satellite programs. Serve as faculty adviser to students. Perform administrative tasks as directed by the department chair. Coordinate and teach courses for the Terrorism Studies Minor. Teach writing enriched courses.

Individual who has 3 or more years teaching full-time both online and face to face criminal justice courses at the college level at accredited colleges. Individual who can teach and coordinate the Terrorism Studies minor.

Applicants must hold a Master's in degree with a minimum of 18 graduate credit hours in criminology or criminal justice, or a PhD in criminology or criminal justice. ABD's in criminology or criminal justice will be considered. All earned degrees must be from regionally a credited colleges or universities. A minimum of three years of full-time, in-class (i.e., face to face) teaching experience at a regionally accredited college and/or university are required for this position. Online teaching experience is also desired. Applicants who are not able to teach on the university's main campus will not be considered.

Applicants are requested to provide a cover letter and CV outlining required education requirements, work experience and contact information for 3 references. Do not send reference letters or official transcripts until requested to do so. Application review will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled.

This position is subject to the successful completion of an employment background check. An employment background check includes a criminal background check, employment verification, reference checks, license verification (if applicable) and credit history check (if applicable).

In compliance with federal law, all persons hired will be required to verify identity and eligibility to work in the United States and to complete the required employment eligibility verification form upon hire.

New employees are paid only by direct deposit to the financial institution of their choice. Candidates claiming Veterans Preference must attach a copy of their DD-214 as a part of the online application process.
