





Articulation Agreement
University of North Carolina at Pembroke
and Montgomery Community College
and Montgomery County Schools
Teacher Education
May - 2021

This Articulation Agreement is established by and between the University of North Carolina at Pembroke, Montgomery Community College, and Montgomery County Schools and is applicable to students who complete the required hours for the Associate in of Arts in Teacher Education or Associate of Science in Teacher Education from Montgomery Community College and transfer to the University of North Carolina at Pembroke and complete a major in the Educator Preparation Program (EPP). Transfers who have not completed the Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis. Participants will be part of Montgomery County Schools Homegrown Teachers program to recruit and retain teachers in Montgomery County.

The University of North Carolina at Pembroke, located in Pembroke, NC, is a four-year public university and part of the University of North Carolina system. UNC Pembroke is regionally accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges to award Baccalaureate and Master's level degrees.

Montgomery Community College, located in Troy, NC, is a two-year public community college and part of the North Carolina Community College System. Montgomery Community College is regionally accredited by the Southern Association of College and Schools Commission on Colleges to award associate degrees, diplomas and certificates.

Montgomery County Schools, located in Troy, NC, wants to increase the recruitment and retention of highly qualified teachers and administrators. Montgomery County Schools has 549 employees (287

certified) and approximately 3,600 students in six elementary schools, two middle schools, one central high school, one learning academy, and one early college within the school system. The Homegrown Teachers program will recruit students in Montgomery Community College and Montgomery County Schools to enter the teaching profession and complete their licensure to return to teach in Montgomery County Schools.

#### The parties agree to the following:

- Students will be enrolled through dual-enrollment or as a transient student their last semester at
  Montgomery Community College to take EDN 2100 Introduction to Education through UNC
  Pembroke. During this semester they will enroll as a non-degree seeking student and complete the
  consortium form.
- 2. All students must meet UNC Pembroke transfer admissions requirements. The student must complete a UNC Pembroke application. Final admission to UNC Pembroke is contingent upon the submission of an official Montgomery Community College transcript as well as official transcripts from any other college from which credits are used to meet graduation requirements prior to enrolling at UNC Pembroke. OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS no matter what.
- Only courses with a grade of "C" or higher will be accepted for transfer credit except for EDN
   2100 Introduction to Education which requires a grade of B- or better for admission to the EPP.
- 4. Students must complete a minimum of 9 hours of Writing Intensive courses at UNC Pembroke.

  Graduation from UNC Pembroke is based on successful completion of General Education, which is required for all baccalaureate degrees, and upon successful completion of a specialized program for a major.
- 5. UNC Pembroke does not limit the number of transfer credits in which a student can transfer; however, a minimum of 25 percent of the semester hours applied toward a bachelor's degree must be earned through regular enrollment in UNC Pembroke. For more information, please refer to UNC Pembroke's specific degree requirements for majors. A course equivalency chart is attached to this document (Attachment A).
- 6. The student will matriculate with all privileges and benefits available to students enrolled at UNC Pembroke including financial aid, student government leadership, academic transfer honors, and social organizations.
- 7. Homegrown Teachers would allow the student to student teach back in Montgomery County. The student will register for Clinical Practice in a Montgomery County Schools and complete the student teaching semester in Montgomery County Schools.

- 10. This agreement will be reviewed and revised every 3 years. **NOTE: The Director of Academic and Military Outreach serves as the point of contact for revising all existing bilateral articulation agreements.**

#### UNCP Pathway for Teacher Education Associate of Arts or Associate of Science

Students would complete the 60-61 hour program at the community college and transfer into UNCP prepared to enter the Educator Preparation Program (EPP).
