**General Education Subcommittee March 2023** 

UNC-Pembroke's General Education curriculum is similar in many respects to its peer and system institutions. Some areas that the General Education Subcommittee recommend looking at are as follows:

- VII. English/Writing/Literature UNCP requires nine hours (six hours of English composition, three hours of literature). Two other system school requires this amount (Appalachian State and UNC-Wilmington). Other system schools require less (from three to seven hours), as do six out of eleven of the peer institutions studied (three to six hours).
- VIII. Electives a number of schools do not have a specific category for General Education electives (ten out of fifteen system schools; seven out of eleven peer institutions), so this could be an area worth looking at.

IX. Global Studies/Diversity – in addition to our recently implemented ICC requirement, a global studies/diversity aspect may be worth investigating. Ten out of fifteen system schools and six out of eleven peer institutions have a General Education diversity component.
