V. Report from the Vice Chancellor for Finance and Administration
The Vice Chancellor for Finance and Administration reported that the Board of
Trustees approved the all funds request budget. They will be sending the budget to
the Board of Governors. They will be doing some internal allocations about a 3% cut,
the bulk of it is going into Academic Affairs, but this is all subject to the legislature's
budget. The Vice Chancellor for Finance and Administration is not sure when they
will get the state budget but is 80% confident that there will be a salary increase

across the board. All recurring reserves have been used. Enrollment is looking very promising.

The committee discussed plans for open meetings for faculty on budget topics and any other business that next year's committee should take up. Based on the discussion, the committee will focus on six items.

- 2. A survey of what faculty would like to know topics of interest, not just during a pandemic/crisis but also during a regular semester.
- 3. Come up with a tentative schedule for a session.
- 4. A survey of when faculty would want to hold a presentation.
- 5. Looking at positive things as well as shortfalls such as research funding and professional development.
- 6. Budget 102 calendar time/dates of the one-time funding as suggested by the Vice Chancellor for Finance and Administration.
